

## Monsaraz

**BEST FOR** Foodie delights. BED DOWN AT São Lourenço do Barrocal.

A couple of hours' drive from Lisbon, in the countryside of Alentejo, olive groves and vineyards fill the 780 hectares surrounding the farmstead of São Lourenço do Barrocal. In the same family for generations, it's been lovingly restored and the result is magical. Forty beautiful rooms and cottages sit either side of a cobbled street lined with orange trees. And when it comes to dining, from slabs of honeycomb and freshly baked bread to kitchen-garden veggies, the food is farm-to-table and exquisite. The whole place has an unhurried vibe, the air is silent bar the occasional hoopoe call or rustle of the trees, and the spa, by Susanne Kaufmann, is an instant mellower.

## Torres Vedras

**BEST FOR** Nature-loving hippies.

**BED DOWN AT** Areias do Seixo. It's hard to believe the wild coast of Torres Vedras, in Portugal's central region, is just an hour's drive north from Lisbon. An uplifting eco-haven, Areias do Seixo is the perfect place to recharge post-wedding. Despite its modern exterior, connections to nature abound. Decor is country-barn cool, bikes are labelled 'pick one and fly' and swing seats bob at reception. The 14 rooms and 13 villas feature doors scrawled with poetry, African-inspired art and four-poster beds. Pick Prata for its Jacuzzi and bathroom fireplace or Oxalá for views of wide lawns and pine-tree forests. Rooms from £240 per night, including breakfast.
